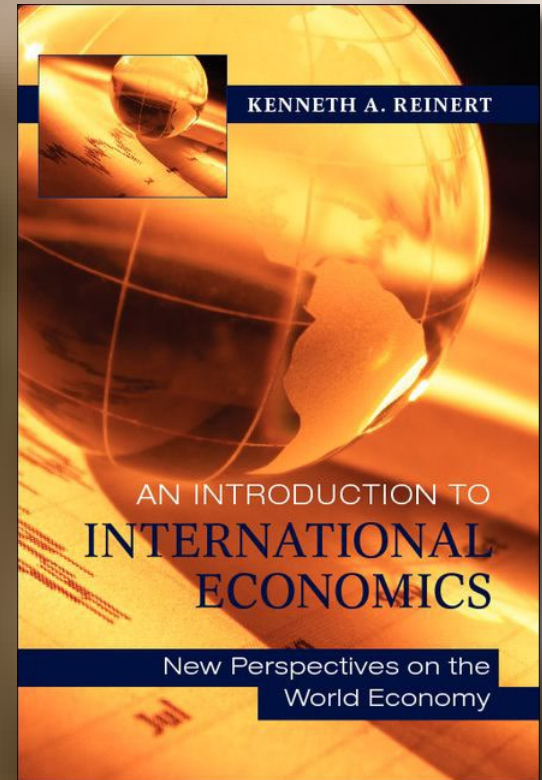

This accessible text is designed for courses in international economics primarily targeting non-economic majors and programs in business, international relations, public policy and development studies. The book assumes a minimal background in microeconomics and mathematics and goes beyond the usual trade-finance dichotomy to give equal

treatment to four “windows” on the world economy: international trade, international production, international finance, and international development. It takes a practitioner point of view rather than a standard academic view, introducing the student to the material they need to become effective analysts in international economic policy.
